

Conference resolves that:

- 1) Big Flame as a national organisation should dissolve, recognising its achievements and celebrating the work it has done over the years.
- 2) That Conference spends a half day in an exchange of ideas to establish what it is in our politics that has been useful, where we have succeeded and where we have failed. This will form the guidelines for future work undertaken by individuals and groups.
- 3) That the existin groups should be encouraged to prioritise their local activity and become as active as possible keeping alive our tendency where it works. This means not solely involving themselves in local campaigns, but tackling national and international issues where appropriate.
- 4) That previous and present members should be encouraged to form local groups to do likewise.
- 5) Conference devots a half day's discussion period to working out how relationships should be maintained between groups, groups and other organisations, (e.g. Socialist Federation, Socialist Society) parties, publications and campaigns in order that what is still alive in our tendency can maintain a clear and active profile. This to include discussion of dayschools and summer schools as well as whether and how to have a network.
- 6) Conference provide a brief for four people to act as "political receivers" to wind up BF's affairs.
Suggestions include: Documents to be given to the archive at Warwick University, Some documents to be destroyed in the interests of security, Writing to all our contacts here and overseas to tell them what has happened, deciding what to do with our assets, determining if a levy is necessary in order to fund this.

Conference resolves that:

- 1) Our political tendency is still important but that the form it now takes needs to be re-examined.
- 2) Current and past BF members, along with a lot of contacts, constitutes a tremendous resource of ideas and activity.
- 3) That Conference sets up a modest structure to continue links as far as useful to us all which explore joint activity and developing ideas around a new politics of our tendency.
- 4) The form taken to do this should be a two-monthly national meeting, supporting whatever comrades are able to organise locally, on a sector level, in terms of a modest but edited public magazine and an internal bulletin.
- 5) The areas we would want to develop ideas and activity around would include 'the global production line', 'antisexism is an issue for the whole class struggle', unemployment, anti-NATO and so on.
